# Discrimination/harassing behavior protocol



#### The 3 most important things to remember

- 1. Apply NFHS rules as they should be enforced and penalize appropriately including ejections
- 2. Officials need to follow the process <u>repeatedly if needed.</u> Order of steps may change, but same things always happen:
  Alert your partners and game management
  Inform coaches and captains (then they inform their team)
  Report the incident at the conclusion of the game
- 3. Only game management can terminate the contest due to discrimination/harassment events
  - Rule 2.4.4 still applies the official may declare a forfeit when conditions warrant (e.g. unsafe situation if game management has decided not to act)




## Responsibilities

Who	What	
Officials	<ul> <li>Apply penalties</li> <li>Stop/start the game</li> <li>Alert Game Management when you hear it</li> <li>Inform the coaches when it happens</li> <li>Report it after the game to the assignor</li> </ul>	
Coaches & Captains	Inform their teams	
Game Management	<ul> <li>Alert officials when they hear it</li> <li>Decision maker on stopping contest if repeated actions occur</li> </ul>	


## Handling Discriminatory Events



#### Behavior is seen or heard by an official




# Behavior is seen or heard & reported to an official

#### Example – Profanity

*"What if a player swears and drops and f-bomb?"* 

If it's just **PROFANITY** it's **Unsportsmanlike Technical,** and the official has the jurisdiction to upgrade to a Flagrant Technical and ejection

If the language used and directed is **DISCRIMINATORY** in nature, then the new procedures apply and a **Flagrant Technical** is warranted

#### Example – Taunting Scenario

A player dunking and flexing his biceps would be a form of **taunting**, and therefore an **Unsporting Technical**.

A player dunking and using **discriminatory language** directed at the opponent — with or without the bicep flex, would be a Flagrant Technical and ejection according to these new guidelines.
